ADMISSIONS POLICY

The family should agree without reservation with the Statement of Faith, Vision, Mission, Philosophy, and Core Values of Praise Academy.

Praise Academy requires the family applying to be faithful to a local church and to be a follower of Jesus Christ.

Enrollment is not finalized until the following requirements have been satisfied:

An interview with the school principal – by appointment only (kindergartener must be at the interview)
Admission packet completed

- Complete Student Application
- Certified copy of student's Birth Certificate. Students entering K3 (must be 3 years of age), K4 (must be 4 years of age), K5 (must be 5 years of age), or 1st grade (must be 6 years of age) before September 1st to enroll in the appropriate Kindergarten program.
- ***All Kindergarten students must be potty-trained before attending class!***
- Copy of student's Social Security Card
- Georgia Certificate of Immunization - Form #3231 (K3, K4, K5)
- Georgia Certificate of Ear, Eye and Dental Exam - Form #3300 (K5)
- Pastor Recommendation Form
- Administrator / Counselor Questionnaire
- K–12th Grade Student Agreement Form
- Emergency Information
- Registration Matriculation fees are paid (fees are not refundable).

After School Care: 3:20pm – 6:00pm
- Children should be dropped off under the canopy between 7:30-8:20am. Children will be escorted to the classroom by the Safety Patrol. Before 7:30am parents should take their child to the lunchroom to be signed in for early care. Before school staff will sign in your child. After 8:20am parents should go to the school office to get a tardy pass. Parents, please do not park and bring your child into the school unless it is after 8:20am.

INSPECTIONS

The Praise Academy Kindergarten Program meets all state regulations for church-run Christian schools. Building, fire, sanitation, health and safety guidelines are inspected on a regular basis. Fire drills are conducted once a month.

- Tuition is due on the 1st and late after the 5th of each month. There is a \$25.00 late fee after the 5th of the month.
- Student(s) will not be allowed to attend class if that month's tuition is not paid by the 16th day of the month.
- All Tuition and Fees (Registration, Enrollment, Technology, Graduation) are NON-REFUNDABLE.
- \$500.00 Early Withdrawal Fee for any student withdrawing during the school year.

Please note: The 10-payment plan is for the convenience of parents who wish to make monthly payments. This does not mean that a parent is paying for a particular month of the school year.

ILLNESS POLICY

We know how much your child will enjoy coming to school and never want to miss a day, however, in the event that your child becomes sick, please let the school know by either calling the **770-943-2484** or emailing the school office at shelly.franks@praiseacademy.com.

A child that has a fever, diarrhea, unexplained rash, runny nose of “green or yellow” (this usually means an infection), infectious diseases, any viral symptoms, or is vomiting will not be allowed in school or Extended Care until the child has recovered. A child with a fever that consists of 100 degrees or more will need to be fever free for twenty-four hours before returning to school. If your child is sick during the night, he should not attend school the following day. Please do not give medication to simply control the symptoms. In most cases, the child will run a fever after the medication wears off and is still contagious to the other children and teachers. If your child becomes sick while at school, you will be called and asked to pick them up immediately. Children may return after they have been symptom free for 24 hours.

Keep Your Child At Home If...

- I'm vomiting (two or more times in 24 hours)
- I have a rash, lice or nits (body rash, especially with a fever or itching)
- I have diarrhea (2 or more watery stools in 24 hours)
- I have an eye infection (thick mucus or pus draining from the eye)
- I have a sore throat (with a fever or swollen glands)
- I'm just not feeling very good (unusually tired, pale, lack of appetite, confused or cranky)
- I have a fever (temperature of 100° (F) degrees or more without medication.)

Health concerns which should keep a child home from school:

- Children too ill to participate in normal school activities should not be at school. Not only are they unable to benefit from education when ill, they also may infect other children and staff.
- **A child with a temperature greater than 100 degrees orally should stay home until the temperature has been normal for 24 hours.**
- If a child does not appear ill, but has a temperature above 100 degrees orally, the temperature should be checked again after the child has rested quietly for 20 minutes in a room with a comfortable temperature.
- **A child who has vomited at least twice in 24 hours or is unable to tolerate normal food and drink should stay home until the vomiting has stopped for at least 24 hours.**
- **A child with diarrhea (3 or more watery stools in 24 hours) should stay home until the diarrhea has stopped for at least 24 hours. A child with persistent diarrhea should be seen by a doctor.**
- A child with a known or suspected communicable disease should stay home until a doctor approves his return to school, (in writing) or the symptoms are no longer present. (Examples of communicable diseases: strep throat, chickenpox, shingles, herpes simplex, hepatitis A, impetigo, fungus skin infections, head lice, scabies, reddened eye with thick mucus or pus draining from it. When a child is diagnosed with such a disease, the school health office should be alerted.)
- A child with a rash of unknown cause should stay home until seen and released by a doctor as being not contagious, or until the rash is gone.
- A child who has undergone a medical procedure requiring general anesthesia should stay home for at least 24 hours following anesthesia.
- A child with upper respiratory infection (symptoms: persistent nasal discharge that is discolored, elevated temperature, productive excessive cough) should stay home until symptoms are improved at least 24 hours, or school attendance is approved in writing by a physician.

- A child without fever, but with a mild cough, runny nose, and nasal congestion may be at school with the approval of the school office.
- A child who has been receiving antibiotic medication for at least 24 hours, and is without fever and otherwise well, may be at school.
- If a child needs to take medication while at school, written physician and parent approval, along with medication in a pharmacy labeled container, is required.
- **In addition to the conditions listed above when a child vomits, has diarrhea, or has a fever of 100 degrees or more at school, the child will be sent home from school.**

MEDICATION

Each student is required to have an emergency information form in the school office. No medical assistance can be provided without that information.

All medicine must be brought into the office and kept during the school day. A note must be sent from home indicating dosage and time for medicine to be administered. The office cannot dispense medicine without written consent from the parents. Over the counter drugs must be maintained in the original container.

Prescription drugs must be in original container, bearing the name of patient, the name of physician prescribing the medication and the name of the pharmacy filling the prescription. NO medicine will be allowed to remain with the student during the school day.

OUTSIDE PLAY

Except in intense heat or inclement weather, children will have an outdoor time each day. If your child has been absent due to illness, he will still be expected to go outside for fresh air and sunshine but will be encouraged not to run or overdo it. Make sure your child has appropriate wear for outside activities. Please send a note if your child has special needs concerning outside play.

FOOD

Students should bring an afternoon snack.

Lunchroom Guidelines

FOOD ALLERGIES: Please notify the school office and lunchroom staff in writing, if your child has food or drink allergies.

Students may bring their lunch from home (brown bag style only...**NO WARM UPS ALLOWED**).

Cafeteria Meal Cost – Kindergarten through 6th grade meals are \$4.00 and include a daily entrée, salad, or wrap options, with a selection of side items and a beverage.

PERSONAL ARTICLES

Children are not to bring toys, games, etc., unless they are listed on their activity calendar or the teacher has given special permission. PA cannot be responsible for any article brought from home that is lost or damaged.

PARENT COMMUNICATION

Teacher/Parent Conferences will be held as needed. The parent, as well as the teacher, may request them. Any minor problems that may arise should be directed to the teacher before bringing them to the attention of the administrator. If you believe there is still a problem after talking with the teacher, please contact the school office. Teachers will strive to keep parents well informed of a child's development. Please check your email and your child's book bag each day for announcements. Remove papers from your child's bag daily so we can be sure you have seen all papers.

RenWeb/ParentsWeb is the official source for information about Praise Academy events, policies, grades, homework, parent announcements, and communication between parents and teachers. Parents should notify the school office if they don't have internet access. Parents should let teachers know as well.

If we post something on www.RenWeb.com, we consider that to be proper notification of important events and policies, so please refer to it often. You can access ParentsWeb via the school's website www.praiseacademy.com.

ARRIVAL/DEPARTURE

Children should be dropped off under the canopy between 7:30-8:20am. Children will be escorted to the classroom by the Safety Patrol. Before 7:30am parents should take their child to the lunchroom to be signed in for early care. Before school staff will sign in your child. After 8:20am parents should go to the school office to get a tardy pass. Parents please do not park and bring your child into the school unless it is after 8:20am.

Student Drop-Off and Pick-Up:

Early morning care (\$5.00 per day per child) is available from 7:00am to 7:30am. Students may be dropped off after 7:30am at no charge.

Student pick-up in the afternoon will be as follows: (Full Day Kindergarten)

K3-4th Grades: Line up in the car line. Students are dismissed at 2:55pm.

7th-12th Grades: Line up in the car line to the far-right lane until 3:20pm. Students are dismissed at 3:20pm.

If you have students in both lower and upper levels to pick up, please line up in the far-right lane and pick up both age children at the same time after 3:20pm. If you pick up a K5-6th student before 3:20pm and have a 7th-12th student to pick up as well, you will be asked to circle back around the line until 3:20pm. We ask that all parents please follow these guidelines and be patient and courteous.

PLEASE, DO NOT PARK & PICK UP YOUR CHILD...PLEASE STAY IN THE CAR LINE!!!

Students will not be allowed to cross the line of traffic in the parking lot. We ask that all parents stay in the car line to pick up their child. This will provide safety to all students. Parents of K3 through sixth grade will be issued a gold ID card for pickup. ID cards must be placed in clear view when going through the car line. If you have limited time and must pick up your child early you must come in the school office and sign your student out by 2:45. Students will not be dismissed before 3:00 for elementary and 3:20 for 7th-12th grades without parental sign out. Please do not park in the student parking spaces. They will be numbered numerically.

INFORMATION CHANGE

Any changes that occur on your child's application or health forms must be turned into the school office as soon as possible.

VISITATION

All parents and visitors to the school must check in at the school office to receive a visitor's badge. Prior permission must be obtained from the school before parents or visitor can spend a significant amount of time in the classroom or on school campus.

DRESS STANDARDS

Girls: All clothing must be modest in appearance. Clothing with insignias, pictures, or slogans promoting unwholesome themes may not be worn. Girls may wear modest dresses, shorts, slacks, jeans, or athletic pants. The hemline should be such that the undergarments are not seen. Also, tank tops or spaghetti straps are not allowed. **A change of clothes in a large plastic bag should be kept in the child's book bag at all times in case of an accident.**

1. Hair should be neat and fad hairstyles are not permitted.
2. Regular Tennis shoes must be worn for play on the gym floor. We suggest students wear regular tennis shoes at all times.

Boys: All clothing must be modest in appearance. Clothing with insignias, pictures, or slogans, or pictures promoting unwholesome themes may be worn. **A change of clothes in a large plastic bag should be kept in the child's book bag at all times in case of an accident.**

1. Hair should be neat and fad hairstyles are not permitted.
2. Regular Tennis shoes must be worn for play on the gym floor. We suggest students wear regular tennis shoes at all times.

Hair shall be neat and well-groomed of a conservative style. (Note: Determinations as to what is considered, "Neat and well-groomed of a conservative style" will be left to the judgment of the school administration.

1. Hair must be out of the eyes.
2. Hair must be off the collar.
3. Hair must be no longer than to the middle of the ear.

No radical hairstyles or cuts are permitted. Haircuts which are unusually shaved or spiked are not allowed. No bushy hair styles, braids, or tails are allowed. No unnatural two-tones dying of the hair is permitted. No unnatural hair colors are allowed.

All students in grades K3, K4, K5 who do not know how to tie their shoes should wear shoes with Velcro closures. Closed shoes or closed-toe sandals are to be worn. Please purchase shoes that are not marking to the floor. We suggest students wear regular tennis shoes.

The following shoes are not permitted:

- flip-flops
- athletic sandals
- no "heelys" ... no shoes with a heel
- any type of "open toe" footwear
- any shoe without a back

DISCIPLINE POLICY

We believe consistent, loving discipline is essential in contributing to a good program. The basic responsibility for discipline resides in the home; therefore, parents will be informed when unusual circumstances arise. It is almost impossible to be of any real help to your child unless you are in active support of what we are attempting to do. Proverbs 3:12, and 19:18, will be of some help in this area. Sometimes a child will persistently have a behavioral problem such as, hitting, biting, or some other form of disobedience. We usually handle these situations by talking with the child, separating him from the rest of the group, or taking away a privilege and making him apologize for his actions. For problems that continue, the parent is asked to come to school for a conference to discuss the child's behavior. We do not administer corporal punishment.

PHYSICAL EXAMINATIONS

The State of Georgia requires all children to have their immunizations up to date. Please complete the appropriate form(s) in your enrollment packet.

PROGRESS REPORTS

Progress reports/report cards are issued each quarter. Parents of all Kindergarten and Pre-school children may consult teachers and staff regarding the progress and behavior of their children at any time.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

Emergency School Closing Procedure

School closings will be communicated by an email alert via Renweb/Parentsweb and/or Remind. If there is a possibility of inclement weather which may affect school openings, parents should check their email and/or listen/view the news on ABC, NBC, OR CBS for specific announcements regarding Praise Academy (Total Learning Center) inclement weather closings. **PLEASE DO NOT CALL THE SCHOOL STAFF REGARDING SCHOOL CLOSING.**

BIRTHDAY PARTIES

- No birthday parties allowed.
- Only store bought/package cupcakes may be brought for break or lunch.
- No homemade items may be brought to school.

Please reserve birthday cakes and celebrations for your home celebration.

All birthdays will be announced monthly during chapel service.

Please do not send birthday party invitations to school for distribution unless all students from the class are included. It is very upsetting to the students who do not receive an invitation.

PARTIES

Scheduled class parties are: Fall/Harvest, Thanksgiving, Christmas, Valentine's Day, and End of School. Parents will be given an opportunity to help with class parties. Your child's teacher or room parent will contact you concerning class party arrangements.

POTTY-TRAINED STUDENTS

Children must be potty-trained to enter our Kindergarten and Extended Care programs. Each student is accepted on a two-week basis. Any potty accidents occurring during the two-week time frame will be considered an adjustment period. After two weeks, a maximum of two accidents will be allowed during any thirty-day period. Should any accidents occur after the two allowed, the student will be placed on a two-week withdrawal period for further potty-training by the parents. After the two-week period, the student may re-enter the school without any additional fees. A new thirty-day period will be in effect at that time. Parents will be called to the school when a student has a bowel movement to change and clean the child. The student is encouraged to change him/herself for wetting accidents. Pull-Ups cannot be worn to school or extended care. Always have a clean complete set of clothes in a plastic bag in the event of an accident. If an accident occurs, the soiled clothes will be sent home. Please put a new set of clothes in a bag and send to school.

Potty Trained Students

Children must be potty trained to enter our Preschool/Kindergarten and Extended Care programs. Each student is accepted on a two-week basis. Any potty accidents occurring during the two-week time frame will be considered an adjustment period. After two weeks, a maximum of two accidents will be allowed during any thirty-day period. Should any accidents occur after the two allowed, the student will be placed on a two-week withdrawal period for further potty training by the parents. After the two-week period, the student may re-enter the school without any additional fees. A new thirty-day period will be in effect at that time. Parents will be called to the school when a student has a bowel movement to change and clean the child. The student is encouraged to change him/herself for wetting accidents. Pull Ups cannot be worn to school, during nap time or extended care. Always have a clean, complete set of clothes in a plastic bag in the event of an accident. If an accident occurs, the soiled clothes will be sent home. Please put a new set of clothes in a bag and send to school.
